

WHY AN AUTHOR WRITES AN ARTICLE

An article is an idea, a concept, or an image of an imaginary experience, or images of factual experiences, that the author may have come across casually or deliberately and by the use of his/her five senses in a logical and reasonable manner, actually or vicariously partaken or participated in those real or referenced experiences.

An author writes an article because he/she has something he/she believes is worthwhile, and for no other reason than to write about it and to communicate to readers that it has been written. When the writing euphoric state of mind makes its presence known, an author can do nothing other than to write; it is in the blood and must take form in the written word. It is a type of communication and needs to be expressed for the dialogue to take initiative effect upon its readers. Once this is accomplished, both writer and reader can establish a lucid exchange of ideas and come to a comprehension of those ideas.
